

Haremza picks up first win at Colby Second Colorado starter is leaving football program

The crowd at the Thomas County Speedway in Colby saw a good night of racing despite the 20 to 30 m.p.h. winds on Sunday, June 6. All classes had a lot of passing and very competitive racing.

The Cruisers started out the feature with the team of Glassman and Glassman of Oakley jumping out to the early lead and holding it all the way to the checkered flag. Doty and Doty of Atwood put some pressure on them for most of the race but couldn't get in position to make the pass. Doty and Doty held on for second with Honeyman and Dirks out of Oakley third and Haines and Allenbaugh fourth.

Twenty one cars took the green flag in the Bomber feature. An early pile up in corner one of lap one took some cars out early. When they started again 15 of the original 21 took the green. The 11X car of Ron Haremza of Colby took the lead on lap one and never looked back as he got his first win at the Thomas County Speedway. There was a good race for second between Travis Branum of Menlo, Keith Stegman of Lamar, Colo., Raymond Dechant of Lamar, Duane Wahrman of Palco, and Brent Moss of Menlo. All five of these cars battled it out for a number of laps until Wahrman made his move on the top side of the track and went on to finish second by about six inches over Branum. Stegman and Moss finished out the top five. Heat race winners were Haremza, David Schemm and Stegman.

The Super Stock feature started out pretty much the same way the Bombers did, with a pile up in the first corner of lap one. When the dust settled and the cars restarted Mike Meyers of Sharon Springs took the early lead. Ronnie Hill, also of Sharon Springs, made a hard charge on the high side of the track to come from his sixth starting spot

and take the lead at the half-way point of the race. Hill went on to win followed by Meyer, Justen Beakley of Lamar and Brad Wagoner of Colby. Heat race winners were Beakley and Meyer.

The Modifieds did not have a restart the whole evening as every race they had went from green to checkered. Jeff Hartwell of Colby led lap one with Darren Deloach of Lamar hot on his back bumper. They had a good race for the lead for several laps before Deloach overtook Hartwell. Dwayne Dechant of Lamar and Nick Tubbs of Colby had a great battle for the third spot running a number of laps side by side. Dechant made the pass for good with three laps left to finish third. The race ended with Deloach taking the checkered first followed by Hartwell, Dechant and Tubbs. The heat races were won by Deloach and Tubbs.

Yankees edge Rockies

NEW YORK (AP) — After Javier Vazquez pitched a great game, Jorge Posada made a pretty impressive throw himself.

Vazquez won his fourth straight start and pitched into the eighth inning to lead the New York Yankees past Colorado 2-1 Tuesday night in the Rockies' first visit to Yankee Stadium. After Vazquez came out, Posada threw out pinch-runner Denny Hocking from his knees to end the game.

Vinny Castilla singled with one out in the ninth, and Mariano Rivera struck out Jeremy Burnitz, then went to a 2-2 count on Matthew Holliday. That's when Rockies manager Clint Hurdle sent Hocking.

Posada's throw from behind the plate drew a roar from the near-capacity crowd of 51,852, already noisy and standing because of Rivera's two-strike count. Rivera got his 24th save in 25 chances.

"We're trying to steal a base just to get an infielder to move, open up a channel somewhere," Hurdle said. "Rivera's a pretty formidable closer. We're just trying to make

something happen late."

The throw punctuated yet another strong performance from Vazquez (7-4). He retired his first 13 batters, struck out six and gave up five hits.

Athletes participating in **any sport** during the 2004-05 school year are strongly encouraged to attend, said Quenzer. He added that "success next year will be determined by how much time athletes put in the weight room this summer."
