Area range management school nears

Western Prairie Resource Conservation and Development Area, Inc. will be holding a three-day Rangeland Management Advanced School.

The school will be held on August 25-27, 2004, at the Methodist Camp Lakeside, Scott Lake, Scott City, said Duane Cheney, coordinator.

"Educators from Kansas State University, University of Missouri, Natural Resources Conservation Service, and ranchers will provide information on developing management plans," he said, and the school is split into classroom and in-field activities."

The first day will be an introductory overview of rangeland management. Registration will begin at 9 a.m. (CDT).

"That evening Kit Pharo, eastern Colorado rancher, will be our guest speaker," he said.


The second day will be more intense one-on-one training on planning options. The participants will learn how to identify problems, opportunities and concerns on managing rangeland.

"They will inventory their resources, evaluate alternatives, and learn plan implementation and evaluation," Cheney said.

The final day students will be working with; range condition calculations; grazing duration and stocking rates; grazing dates; percentage grazing; and plotting grazing schedules.

Registration will cover two nights lodging, meals, and school materials.
