

Associated Press Writer TOPEKA (AP) — Have verse?

The Kansas Arts Commission is searching for the state's first poet laureate and is accepting nominations until Sept. 1. While the position is designed as an honor, the person who holds it also is supposed to develop a program for promoting poetry.

The commission established the new position with the encouragement of Gov. Kathleen Sebelius. Both the commission and Sebelius' office said they have received regular inquiries in recent years about whether Kansas has such a job and suggestions that the job should be created.

idea," Dave Wilson, the while others, like Florida, make commission's director, said during a Tuesday interview.

Thirty-eight states have poet laureate positions, though not all of them are filled, according to the Library of Congress. The states include Colorado, Georgia, Florida, Illinois and Mississippi, and the library said California was the first to create the position in 1915.

In Kansas, Sebelius liked the idea of having a poet laureate, said spokeswoman Nicole Corcoran, because, "It's a good idea to honor Kansas poets and raise awareness about poetry."

The Arts Commission plans to form a committee to screen nominations, with poets laureate serving "The more we looked at it, the two-year terms, the first starting on

lifetime appointments.

Individuals and groups can make nominations, but poets will not be allowed to nominate themselves. Also, the Arts Commission is looking for someone with an "established history" of having poems published, with at least one book of verse published commercially.

Also, students will not be eligible, and the laureate must be at least 18 and have lived in Kansas for at least 10 years.

"This is a program to recognize someone with a significant body of work," Wilson said.

Travel also will be part of the job, though the commission will let the new poet laureate to develop a program for promoting poetry. Karen
