# olorado Rockies rally over Giants 10-9

AP Sports Writer DENVER (AP) — After watching the San Francisco Giants score four runs in the ninth inning in the series opener, the Colorado Rockies figured a three-run deficit wouldn't be too much to overcome.

Besides, this is Coors Field, where almost no lead is safe.

Jeromy Burnitz and Preston Wilson each homered off Matt Herges and Aaron Miles capped Colorado's four-run ninth inning with an RBI single, helping the Rockies rally for a 10-9 victory Sunday over the San Francisco Giants.

"That's about as good as it gets," Rockies manager Clint Hurdle said.

Colorado's comeback, which earned the Rockies a series split, was eerily similar to Thursday night, when closer Shawn Chacon gave up four runs in the ninth inning of a disheartening 7-5 loss.

San Francisco led 9-6 heading into the bottom of the ninth after Deivi Cruz hit a tiebreaking homer son just inside the pole in left. "I didn't fool anybody today,"

said Herges, who blew his seventh save in 29 chances. "It was just one of those days where they owned me like they knew what was coming."

Matt Holliday chased Herges with a single, then moved to second on Charles Johnson's sacrifice off Scott Evre.

Todd Greene was intentionally walked and Miles followed with single over Bonds' head in left that allowed Holliday to score easily.
