

Annual Dane G. Hansen scholarship programs announced

The Dane G. Hansen Foundation will make 220 scholarships available in five categories to students in 26 northwest Kansas counties for the 2004-2005 academic year. The number of scholarships offered this year has been increased by 32.

Students from an accredited high school, registered independent, private or home school in one of the following 26 counties are eligible to apply: Cheyenne, Cloud, Decatur, Ellis, Ellsworth, Gove, Graham, Jewell, Lincoln, Logan, Mitchell, Norton, Osborne, Ottawa, Phillips, Rawlins, Republic, Rooks, Russell, Saline, Sheridan, Sherman, Smith, Thomas, Trego and Wallace.

Scholarships available for students who will graduate in the current academic year are:

Ten Leaders of Tomorrow Schol-

arships with annual stipends of \$5,000 renewable for three additional years if criteria established by the Scholarship Committee are met. Recipients must attend an accredited four-year public, private or church related Kansas College or university.

Thirty-five Hansen Scholar Scholarships with stipends of \$3,000 renewable for one additional year, provided the recipients have achieved at least a 3.00 GPA at the college level.

Recipients must attend and accredited four-year public, private or church-related Kansas college or university.

Seventy Hansen Student Scholarships of \$2,000 each (non-renewable). Recipients may attend any accredited community, public, pri-

vate or church related college or university in Kansas.

To qualify for the above scholarships, a student must have at least a 3.50 GPA. The student should be an active participant in extracurricular school and community activities, displaying good citizenship, leadership, moral integrity and be proficient in written and verbal skills.

Students planning to enter the competition for Leaders of Tomorrow, Hansen Scholar or Hansen Student scholarships must register at their school and take the qualifying test at locations to be announced.

Information on all scholarships has been sent to qualifying area schools. Tentative test dates have been set for Sept. 23 and 24.

The Dane G. Hansen Foundation also offers 90 Vocational Education Scholarships (non-renewable) to high school seniors. An applicant for the Vocational Education Scholarship in the amount of \$1,500 must complete an application form

which is available from the high school counselor or principal. The Scholarship Committee will be interested in the student's character, activities, goals and six-semester grades. Applicants for the Vocational Education Scholarships are not required to take a qualifying test. A 3.50 GPA is not necessary to apply for this scholarship.

In addition to the scholarships offered to high school seniors, the Hansen Foundation will also award 15 Community College Scholarships with stipends of \$2,000 each. These scholarships are available for Kansas Community College graduates of the current school year who plan to continue their education at a four-year Kansas college or university. Applicants must be former graduates of a high school in one of the above mention 26 counties of northwest Kansas, have completed college work with a 3.00 GPA or better and possess good character and leadership qualities. Each Community College Scholarship

may be renewed for one year upon completion of satisfactory work as evaluated by the Scholarship Committee. Students may obtain application forms from the office of the Dean of Student Services at the community college or by writing or calling the Hansen Foundation office in Logan.

Through scholarships the trustees of the Dane G. Hansen Founda-

tion encourage good citizenship and high achievement in academic endeavors. Improvement of educational opportunities for students in western Kansas ranks high among the objectives of the trustees of the Hansen Foundation.

Bioscience group named

TOPEKA (AP)—Gov. Kathleen Sebelius and legislative leaders have appointed a new group to oversee efforts to build the state's biosciences industry.

The appointees, announced earlier this week, include former U.S. Agriculture Secretary Dan Glickman, now the head of the Motion Picture Association of America. Glickman also is a former congressman from Kansas' 4th District.

The Kansas Economic Growth Act, which took effect on July 1, created the Kansas Biosciences Authority. State officials hope to create 20,000 new jobs by 2015.

Sebelius and legislators expect

the act to generate between \$500 million and \$600 million over the next decade to help small businesses, recruit scholars to conduct research, build world-class biosciences facilities and fund the commercialization of products and businesses stemming from the research.

The money will come from taxes generated by new jobs, set aside to fund such initiatives.

Sebelius made two appointments, and legislative leaders make six. The ninth member is appointed by the Kansas Technology Enterprise Corporation, a state agency that nurtures high-tech businesses.

City searches for slogans

TOPEKA (AP) — The city of Topeka is looking for a few good words to promote the city's image.

Officials planned to begin a contest in October for a city slogan, with the winning motto to be announced around Dec. 5, Topeka's 150th anniversary.

But *The Topeka Capital-Journal* decided to get a head start on the contest, and many of the suggestions it got from readers may have city officials shaking their heads.

One suggestion, "Topeka, A City of Characters," spoofed Topeka's City of Character program.

Other suggestions that aren't likely to win official approval included "Topeka, you won't get a lot of unwanted relatives visiting you," and "Topeka — not as bad as you think."

Some other suggestions may be closer to what the mayor is looking for. For example, there was "Topeka, a great place to grow."
