# Annual Dane G. Hansen scholarship programs announced

Students from an accredited high school, registered independent, private or home school in one of the following 26 counties are eligible to apply: Cheyenne, Cloud, Decatur, Ellis, Ellsworth, Gove, Graham, Jewell, Lincoln, Logan, Mitchell, Norton, Osborne, Ottawa, Phillips, Rawlins, Republic, Rooks, Russell, Saline, Sheridan, Sherman, Smith, Thomas, Trego and Wallace.

Scholarships available for students who will graduate in the current academic year are:

\$5,000 renewable for three additional years if criteria established by the Scholarship Committee are met. Recipients must attend an accredited four-year public, private or church related Kansas College or university.

To qualify for the above scholarships, a student must have at least a 3.50 GPA. The student should be an active participant in extracurricular school and community activities, displaying good citizenship, leadership, moral integrity and be proficient in written and verbal skills.

Information on all scholarships has been sent to qualifying area schools. Tentative test dates have been set for Sept. 23 and 24.




