LONDON (AP) — An alleged key al-Qaida operative suspected of authoring surveillance documents that sparked terror alerts in the United States was among 13 terror suspects arrested in Britain, an official said.

The documents of surveillance of five U.S. financial institutions were found on the computers of two accused members of Osama bin Laden's terror network arrested in Pakistan last month.

Pakistani intelligence officials told The Associated Press the computers also held images of London's Heathrow, Airport and that this information was passed to British of-

The revelations draw a link between two major sweeps against suspected al-Qaida networks in Pakistan and Britain — as well as the alerts announced Sunday in New York, New Jersey and Wash-

At least 20 people have been detained in Pakistan in the past month, and Britain is holding 12 men from raids on Tuesday after releasing one person. British police on Thursday announced the arrest of another man, wanted in the United States for allegedly helping finance terrorist activity.
