The Colby Lady Eagle netters had a good outing in Lindsborg this past weekend. The Eagles had a chance to see some top 4A tennis schools and get some quality matches in to prepare them for regionals next month.

Katie Lang earned a 3rd place finish at the #1 singles spot with a 4-1

record. She defeated Jamie Johnson of Smoky Valley 7-3 in the first round, Julie Cox of Pratt 7-0 in the second round. She was defeated by Jessica Ball of Wichita Collegiate 7-3 in the 3rd round and came back to defeat Andrea Hamilton of Baldwin 7-1 in the final round. In the finals she defeated Stasia Spare

of Larned 7-0.

Crystal Mannebach and Logan Wark, #1 doubles, had a good day finishing fifth with a 3-2 record. They came out strong defeating a tough Smoky Valley team comprised of Ruggiero and Hubele 7-5. They faced a stingy Pratt team of Phillips and Roberts who were state qualifiers in singles last year. They kept it close until Pratt came away with a 7-4 win. Wichita Collegiate's Healy and Felt defeated the duo 7-2. Colby bounced back and defeated Hitchcock/Ferris of Baldwin 7-4. In the finals they defeated Barber and Scofield of Nickerson 7-1.

CBS slapped with big fine

WASHINGTON (AP) — CBS was fined a record \$550,000 by federal regulators for Janet Jackson's "wardrobe malfunction," which exposed the singer's breast during the Super Bowl halftime show.

The Federal Communications Commission voted unanimously to slap each of the 20 CBS-owned television stations with the maximum indecency penalty of \$27,500.

The total penalty of \$550,000 is the largest fine levied against a television broadcaster. Most of the FCC's bigger fines have been against radio stations.
