

He simply led a low club from dummy and finessed the nine(!), returned to dummy with the club ace and played the heart ten. East was forced to win and lead a club from the Q-10 to South's K-J to give Zia his ninth trick.

In the post-mortem, the self-effacing Zia pointed out that he had in fact erred by ducking the second heart, which eventually forced him to risk losing a trick to the singleton ten of clubs in the West hand. Had Zia taken the second heart, he could later have played the ace and another club to the nine before exiting with his remaining heart to force East to make the same losing return in clubs.
