

Eagle ladies pick up road win

The Colby varsity Eagle basketball ladies are now 13-3 on the season, thanks to a 48-29 win over the TMP-Marian Monarchs at Hays Monday night.

The Eagles really didn't put this one away until the final quarter.

At the end of the first period of action, Colby held only an 8-7 lead, and by half-time they were up by only four, 21-17.

In the third frame, the Eagles scored but 5 points while the Monarchs struggled to get a mere 2 to lead at the buzzer, 26-19.

It was all Colby in the fourth quar-

ter with the Eagles popping them in from all over the place for a total of 22 points vs. 10 for the host Monarchs.

Lissa Mazanec led the way for the Eagles with 13 points — the only double digit performer for Colby, or the game for that matter.

Others breaking into the scoring column were Jessica Stephens with 2; Brittany Kersenbrock 8, including 2 3-pointers; Emily Sloan 9; Ashley Barnes 7; Zanae Baird 4; and Marcia Kaus 5.

TMP's top point-maker was Hertel with 8.

Colby won the rebounding war, 46-29.

From the field for the game, the Eagles were 40 percent (16/45); from the charity stripe 62.5 percent (10/16); and from 3-point land 33.3 percent (2/6).

For the host bunch, they were 22.6 percent from the floor (12/53); 33.3 percent from the line (4/12); and 6.87 percent from 3-point range (1/15).

The Eagles are at home Friday night vs. Quinter in the Colby Community Building with tip-off at 6:30 p.m.

Eagle boys suffer loss

The first two quarters made the difference — in the loss column for the Colby Eagle boys at the Al Billinger Fieldhouse at TMP in Hays Monday night.

They scored only 10 points in those first two quarters while allowing the Monarch to put up 34.

If we eliminate the first two quarters and concentrate on the third and fourth, the Eagles win, as they bucketed 18 points in the third and 21 in the fourth vs. TMP's 19 in the third and 13 in the fourth.

But four quarters a basketball game make and in this one the Eagle fell, 66-49.

Matt Augustine led the charge for Colby with 14 points, most of them at the free throw line (10/12) and Jared Dinkel was the other Eagle in double figures with 11.

Other scorers were Jordan Sharp with 3, a 3-pointer; Trey Barnett 3; Chris Finley 2; Derek Elliott 5; Trevor Siebert 3, a 3-pointer; Nick Howard 2; Dusty Quenzer 2; and R.J. Ladenburger 4.

For the Monarchs, Felder scored 21 and Hoffman 10.

The Monarchs outrebounded the Eagles 32-27.

Other statistics showed the Eagles shot 27.5 percent from the field (11/40), 33.3 percent from 3-point land (2/6); and 64.1 percent from the free throw line (25/39).

For TMP, it was 53.2 percent from the field (26/47); 57.1 percent from 3-point range (4/7); and 80 percent from the line (12/15).

The Eagles are at home Friday night vs. Quinter.
