

Nine Eagle wrestlers earn trip to 4A State at Wichita

Colby made a super showing in the 4A Regional Wrestling Tournament at the Colby Community Building Friday and Saturday.

As a team, the Eagles finished 3rd, a half-point behind second place Andale. Goodland claimed the championship in convincing style, posting 209.50 points. Andale tallied 158.00 and Colby 157.50.

And the big news for the Colby faithful was qualifying 9 wrestlers for the big Class 4A State showdown at Wichita this coming weekend.

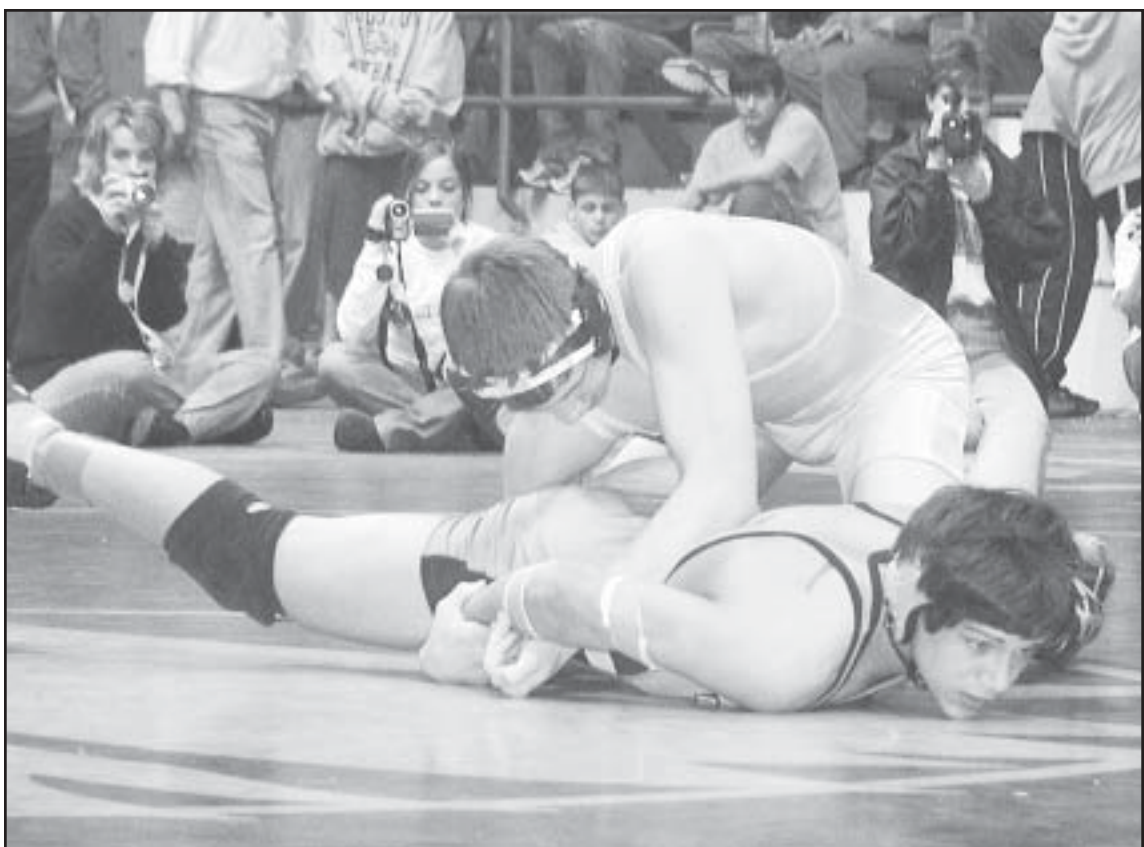

Seven Trojans to national tourney

The Colby Community College wrestling team will travel to Rochester, Minn. this week for the NJCAA national tournament. The Trojans are currently ranked fourth in the country.

There are seven Trojans who have qualified for the event.

• Kyle Patton (Wellsville) will compete at 125 lbs. He is ranked eighth in the country.

• Dan Prater (Pratt) will compete at 133 lbs. He is nursing a broken

hand, but hopefully will be ready to go.

• Mathieu Gilliland (Hoxie) will wrestle at 141 lbs. His number one finish at the qualifying tournament a week ago propelled him into the number four position in the country.

• Matt Schippers (Hoxie), who is eighth in the country, will wrestle at 149 lbs.

• Jason Schippers (Hoxie) will be the Trojan representative at 157 lbs.

• Eric Luedke (Colby), who has

been ranked number one in the country the entire season and won a national championship as a freshman, will wrestle at 165 lbs. He won the qualifying tournament without a problem.

• Zach Luedke (Colby) is the Trojan's last representative. He will wrestle at 174 lbs.

A community wide send-off has been scheduled by college officials for 9 a.m. on Wednesday on campus.

Eagle Ladies slap Atwood, 72-45

The Colby varsity lady Eagles are now 16-3 on the season following a 72-45 victory over Atwood on the road Friday night.

Following a close opening period which saw the Eagles lead at the buzzer, 22-21, Colby romped on the hosts 23-7 to lead at the half, 45-28.

The Eagles added another 24 points in the third to lead 69-39, and pretty much let things stand in the fourth, hitting 3 points while allowing Atwood 6.

Emily Sloan led the way for the Eagles with 23 points. Brittany Kersenbrock added 13 (including 4 3-pointers), Lissa Mazanec 12, Zanae Baird 8, Ashley Barnes 8, Jessica Stephens 6 and Tasha Waggoner 2.

Kramer was tops for Atwood with 18.

Colby was 61 percent from the floor (29 of 47), 66 percent from 3-point range (4 of 6), and 83 percent from the line (10 of 12).

For Atwood is was 43 percent from the field (16 of 37), (no 3 pointers) and 59 percent from the line (13 of 22).

The Eagles led in rebounding, 26-19.
