# Trojan men beat **Colby native**

No Colby Community College Trojan basketball team had ever defeated a Chad Wintz coached team until Wednesday.

John Wood's squad handed Wintz a 85-75 loss. Wintz, a Colby native, spent four years at Dodge City previously and is completing his fifth season with the Hutchinson Blue Dragons.

The win moves the Trojans to 5-8 and the loss drops the Blue Dragons to 7-6.

After some stumbles against Cloud County, Seward and Barton, where the Trojans were hindered by selfish play, Colby had their best first half of the season by using a team approach.

Hutchinson's defense could not contain the Trojan offense. Nate Bowie ended the game with 26 points closely followed by Canedo and Knight each with 17 points.

The Trojans shot 55 percent for the game and allowed the Blue Dragons a 40 percent rate from the floor. The Trojans also shot 41 percent from three-point range.

"We are hitting the ball well enough to win games. Our defense is not making the routine plays to

get us out of an inning. Right now it is a snowball effect when a mistake is made," said coach Carl Adams.

'We have a week to prepare for our first conference game at Dodge City. There are times when we play like we did in the fall but we make a mistake to keep ourselves in a rut."

Despite the early struggles, Adams said the program is receiving attention.

The Colby Lady Trojans defeated Hutchinson Community College 64-41 Wednesday to improve their record to 12-1(24-3) on the season. Both teams had trouble finding the net as Colby shot 35 percent for the game and the Lady Blue Dragons 38 percent. With the victory the Trojans need one more win to assure themselves of first place in the Jayhawk West. Their next opponent is Dodge City Saturday in Colby.

The Trojans had trouble scoring in the first half. Suzana Sormaz, the best three point shooter in the conference, got off to a tough start by going 0-4 in the first half. The Trojans only hit two three-pointers in the first period.

Hutchinson was not much better as they were 0-5 from beyond the arc in the first and 1-13 in the game. Going into the half, the Trojans led 24-18 one of their lowest totals of

Colby corrected some of their scoring woes in the second half. Their shooting percentage only went up from 31 percent to 38 percent but their shot total went from 38 in the first to 52 in the second.

Rita Kollo continued her dominate play by driving to the net every time Hutchinson was in man-toman defense. Kollo finished with a double-double, 15 points and 10 rebounds.

Sormaz hit her groove by sinking 4-5 three pointers in the second half. She ended the game with 12 points. Jamie Schroeder also grabbed 10 boards as the Trojans out-rebounded Hutchinson 46-19.

Colby can seal first place Saturday at the Community Building against Dodge City. Tipoff is scheduled for 6 p.m.
