Rita Kollo led the Trojans with 30 points and 13 rebounds. Suzana Sormaz had 20 points with four three's and Jayci Stone only shot three's. Stone was 5 for 10 from behind the arc and 2 of 2 from the line for 17 points. Shareka Purnell added to the win-

ning effort with 10 assists.

The Lady Trojans shared the ball well all night, tallying 28 assists as a team.

A Dodge City (11-4, 24-5) loss and a Lady Trojan victory over Butler (3-12, 14-15) Saturday afternoon would place the Lady Trojan's in a tie for second in the conference.

Saturday afternoon's regular season finale against Butler County Community College takes place at 2 p.m. in the Colby Community Building.

He followed that with an upset of 2nd-ranked Teyon Ware of Oklahoma in overtime 3-1. Murray, who began the season considering a redshirt yar, was 22-2 when the honor was announced. He was Nebraska's first "Wrestler of the Week" this season. Nebraska will host the Big 12 Championships at Qwest Center in Omaha on Saturday. AJ Steele led off the inning with a double that was followed by seven Trojan singles, which included one by Steele himself. Steve Young capped the inning with a two-run homer to left field. Right hander Kobey McCall earned the

victory by allowing just one walk in five complete innings of work.

Game two was a seesaw battle until Mike Neuberg stepped to the plate with one out in the bottom of the sixth, the score tied at five apiece, and runners at first and second. Neuberg scorched a ground ball that the Plainsmen second baseman couldn't handle. In the process, Brian Sulzman scored the go ahead run. The Trojans tacked on one more in the inning and Travis Mortimore finished off the Plainsmen in the top of the seventh to earn

the victory in relief.

Good outing for Trojan track/field

The last chance qualifier in El Dorado last Friday proved perfect for the Colby Community College Trojans track and field team. They qualified everyone they brought.

Felipe Longoria qualified for nationals in the 800m, with a time of 1:58.1. Longoria will also be going to nationals in the 4 x 800m along with Jerod Kersey and Derrick Monson. Kersey will also compete

in the 5000m.

The 4 x 400m team of Rocky Baalmann, Carlan Arthur, Tyler Sroufe and Evan Kahle qualified with a time of 3:22. Arthur will also be competing in the 800m, the 4 x 800m and the 4 x 400m. He also qualified for the 600m event, but will not run in it.

Kim Crossland qualified for nationals in the high jump with a

height of 5'3". Joy Zumbahlen and Marissa Thomas both qualified in the pentathlon.

These Lady Trojans will join Cassy Hamilton (shot put and weight throw) and Tawny Rice (pole vault), who qualified for nationals earlier in the season.

The NJCAA Nationals will be held in Charleston, Ill. this coming Friday and Saturday.

Colby College men fall to Pratt

The Colby Community College Trojans basketball men made a run at the end of the second half to move within two points of Pratt, but that would be as close as they would get, as the Beavers drove home with a 79-74 victory Wednesday night at the Community Building.

The Trojans were down by as many as 16 in the second half when

with under 10 minutes remaining they made what looked to be a game defining run. Lionel Womack hit three second-half three's to help the Trojans pull close, but the Beavers continued to pressure the basket and held on to the lead.

Womack finished with 15 points on the strength of 4 for 9 shooting from behind the arc. Jamual Warren led the Trojans with 30 points on 55

percent shooting from the field. Both Tezmar Caldwell and Antonio McMillion brought down eight boards to aid the effort.

The Trojans (5-10, 14-14) will face Butler (6-9, 17-12) Saturday at 4 p.m. in the Community Building. A Trojan victory would give them a season sweep of the Grizzlies and possibly propel them into a sixth place finish in the league standings.
