# Antique organ collection open to all

## Bill approved to protect child predators, disabled

TOPEKA (AP) — Criminals preying on children will face harsher penalties under a new law signed Monday by Gov. Kathleen Sebelius.

The governor also signed legislation protecting disabled Kansans from abuse in hospitals, mental health centers or group homes, and banning racial profiling by law enforcement officials.

All the new laws go into effect Julv 1.

The proposals combatting child predators and abuse of the disabled were advocated by Attorney General Phill Kline.

"We have an absolute duty to protect our children and that means putting child predators and child pornographers behind bars," Sebelius said in a statement. "This bill will help law enforcement do just that."

The penalty for indecent solicitation of a child under age 14 was increased, which in many cases would mean prison rather than probation for those convicted of the crime.

Under the new law, prosecutors will be able to charge those possessing child pornography with a crime for each image.
