Sunflower State Games get Colby boost

Free Press Editor A representative from Topeka was in Colby this week promoting the 16th annual Sunflower State Games scheduled for July 15-17 and July 22-24.

Recognizing the games that will begin July 15, Mayor Warren Hixson signed a proclamation honoring the event as a special day in Colby.

"We are encouraging the citizens of this community to participate in and show their support for the state games," Hixson said.

Sherry Lundry, executive director for the games, said this year 33 sports are being offered with 6,000 athletes expected in age groups from 4 years old on up.

"The Sunflower State Games is a statewide amateur sports festival open to all Kansans," she said.

Since its beginning in 1990, the event has mushroomed. At that time, there were 14 sports with about 2,500 participants. Today, Lundry said, there are 33 sports and more than double the amount of athletes taking part.

Another addition to the games was introduced in 2002 with the state-wide essay contest for student in first through sixth grades.


