Time to start thinking about flu shots

Healthy Haps

Who should receive a flu shot? The answer is everyone who is not allergic to eggs and is above the age of six months.

But the flu vaccine is still being targeted for the high risk population first.

Then if enough vaccine is available, anyone who isn't in a high-risk category (as stated above) should receive the flu vaccine to protect against influenza's complications and death.

The optimal time to receive the flu vaccine is usually during October and November.

In facilities housing older persons (nursing homes), vaccination before October typically should be avoided because antibody levels in such people can begin to decline with a limited time after vaccination.

In addition, children aged less than nine years of age who have not been previously vaccinated and who need two doses before the start of the influenza season can receive their first dose in September (provided the vaccine is available) so that both doses of the most up-to-date vaccine can be administered before the onset of influenza activity.

For previously vaccinated children, two doses are needed to provide optimal protection against influenza.

The following are at high risk for influenza:

People aged greater than or equal to 50 years, people aged less than 50 at increased risk for influenza-re-

lated complications (include children aged 6-23 months), household contacts of people at high risk (including out-of-home caregivers and household contacts of children aged 0-23 months), and health care workers.

Because of the unknown amount of vaccine supply, high risk will be considered first to receive the vaccine.

If the vaccine supply is adequate, anyone wishing to be vaccinated can be vaccinated throughout the influenza season (in other words, it is never too late to be vaccinated). Adults develop peak antibody protection against influenza infection two weeks after vaccination.

As the season nears, we will let you know the status of our vaccine supply.
