Time to start thinking about flu shots **Healthy Haps**

Who should receive a flu shot? The answer is everyone who is not allergic to eggs and is above the age of six months.

But the flu vaccine is still being targeted for the high risk population

Then if enough vaccine is available, anyone who isn't in a high-risk category (as stated above) should receive the flu vaccine to protect against influenza's complications and death.

The optimal time to receive the weighed 7 pounds, 10.7 ounces and flu vaccine is usually during October and November.




