

Colby High School Lady Eagles finish well at home tournament

The Colby Eagles Ladies Tennis Team hosted a 10 team pool play tournament on Saturday, Sept. 3. Teams competing included Colby, Garden City, Goodland, Liberal, Norton, Osborne, Phillipsburg, Plainville, Scott City, & Ulysses.

At the #1 singles position, Rachel Funk took second place with a 3-1 record.

Rachel defeated Phillipsburg's Melinda Schremmer 7-1, she defeated Ashlee Cupell of Liberal 7-1 she then defeated Jessica Cook of Norton 7-1.

Since Plainville didn't have a #1 singles player she had a bye the second round and played the winner of the other pool which was Sloane

Hardman of Osborne. She was defeated by Osborne 7-4.

At #1 Doubles Robin Wilson and Nikole Schroeder went 4-1 for the day, good enough for a third place medal. They were defeated 7-5 by Phillipsburg's Allison Dusin and Kayla Jarvis who took first at the meet, but bounced back for three straight wins defeating Jeni Wolters and Andrea Kooops of Osborne 7-3. They defeated Emily Jones and Amber Cooper, Plainville 7-0. They defeated Kali Rietcheck and Megan Stefan of Goodland 7-1. In the finals they defeated Scott City's Kelsey Tankersley and Amanda Murphy 7-5.

"Nikole and Robin came out flat

against a really solid Phillipsburg doubles team," said head coach Mike Fortkamp. "I think if they could have played them towards the end of the tournament we may have had a better shot at winning, but you have to be ready to play right away. I would like to see them both taking control of the net more, especially when we are serving. Confidence will help them do that and practice will give them that confidence. They work well together and now it is time for them to step up their play a notch. Overall, I was really pleased with how they have progressed and look for them to have a great shot at qualifying for state."

At #2 Singles, Logan Wark remained unbeaten finishing first again. This time she defeating Trista Henderson of Scott City 7-2, defeated Norton's Lisa Jones 7-0, she defeated Niki Eveleigh of Norton 7-0, and defeated Vanessa Owings of Plainville 7-3. In the finals she defeated Brittany Newacheck of Liberal 7-1.

"Logan had a great day today. The top players were in her pool and she walked away unbeaten. The next tournament she will play in will be at Lindsborg and that will give her an idea of where she needs to be to make a good run at qualifying for state. She is a hard worker and has the desire to succeed. I look for her to get better as the season progresses."

The #2 doubles team of Rashaun Wilson and Kaylie Dugger had a good day. They finished first again remaining unbeaten. They came away with wins against Plainville's Kayelyn Thyfault and Selby Renk 7-0.

They won 7-2 against Latosha West and Jerica VanCampen of Scott City. They continued winning defeating Osborne's Jeni Wolters and Andrea Kooops 7-0. They defeated Johanna Baez of Garden City 7-3. In the finals they faced Goodland's Jena McCall and Sandy Johnson and defeated them 7-3.

"Kaylie and Rashaun are working well together," Fortkamp said. "They are starting to communicate as a team and you can see that they are really starting to gel. They are fun to watch and fun to coach. I am proud of them for how hard they are working in practice and I hope their efforts pay them dividends in the end."

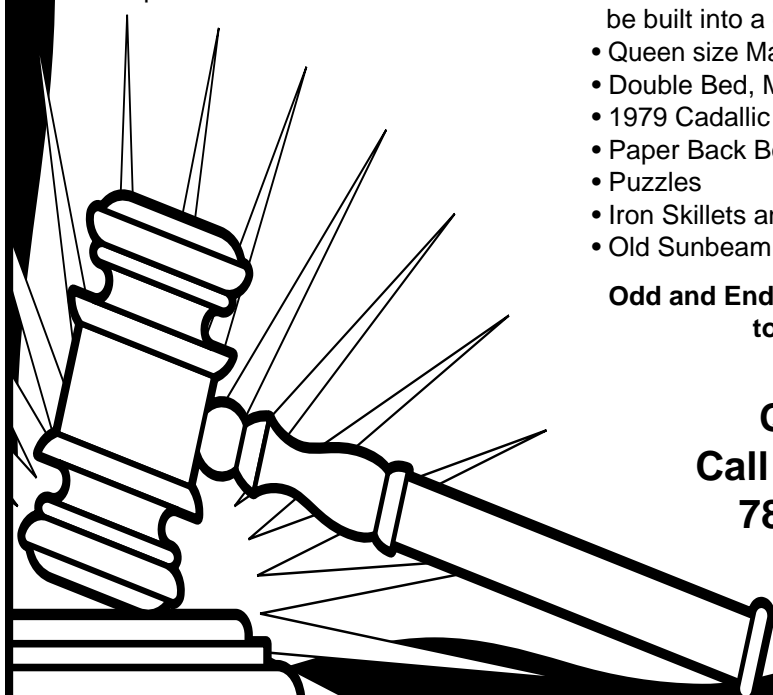
