Former assistant coach charged with four felonies

A former Colby Community College assistant basketball coach has been charged with beating one female student threatening another and pulling a knife on a male stu-

Giang Thai Thanh Phan, 27, has been charged in Thomas County District Court with four felonies and one misdemeanor.

Skip Sharp, interim college presicharges have been filed against Phan, who voluntarily resigned at the Dec. 19 board meeting.

"We've taken our action as far as Phan's resignation and wish him well," Sharp said. "There's no hard feelings of any kind. He's simply a college employee who had some est of the college and himself." As dow, pushed her to the ground,

far as the student victims, Sharp said the college has taken "appropriate action to help them and their parents" and the case with the college is closed.

Phan is charged with criminal threat for his alleged attempt to terrorize a 20-year-old Norton woman sometime between 9 p.m. and 11 p.m. on Oct. 28. While the name of the victim is being withheld, according to court documents filed Nov. 22, Phan is alleged to have told the woman he was "going to hurt dent, said Thursday he is aware her." If convicted, and depending on a presentence investigation, Phan faces 5 to 17 months in prison and a fine of up to \$100,000 for the

He is also charged with criminal restraint, a Class A person misdemeanor, for allegedly having interfered with the woman's liberty to get away from him. If convicted, Phan faces a year in the county jail and a fine up to \$2,500.
