High Plains Lions learn about securities fraud

The High Plains Lions met for unsolicited offers by strangers. buffet dinner at the Prairie Rose Room, president Sheryl Brenn introduced Dr. Bonnie Lynch. Dr. Lynch is one of 29 agents of the Kansas Securities Commission. She gave a very informative talk on investment scams. Some of the highlights included the following:

About 80 percent of scams involve people over 60-years-old. This age group has concerns if they are going to have enough money to retire on and if they will outlive their money. This makes them prey to crooks who promise them big money, "too good to be true." The scam artists like western Kansas because of the friendly and trusting

The commission enforces state securities laws and is the lead agency to help citizens who have been victims of investment fraud. The commission office regulates individuals and companies offering investment opportunities. The person must be licensed and the product must be registered. They investigate, enforce and prosecute cases of alleged investment fraud. The third area of coverage by the office is to educate the public as the best defense against investment fraud. Their motto is "Investigate before

By calling 1-888-40-SCAMS you can find if the person is licensed and the security is registered and if there are any complaints concerning this person or company. "Most of the calls we get are too

late," she said.

Dr. Lynch explained security risk runs from low to high. She used bank CDs as low-risk and off-shore or foreign as high investment risks. Most people who invest money do not have much knowledge concerning their investment.

"People do more research on buying a refrigerator than where they are investing their money," Dr. Lynch said.


