SECTION 2: That Article 1, Section <u>21-103</u>. R-1 – Single Family Dwelling

21-103. R-1 - Single Family Dwelling District

- Height Regulations
 - No building shall exceed two and one-half (2½) stories or thirty-five (35) feet in height.
 - Churches and educational institutions when permitted in this district, may be erected to a height not exceeding sixty (60) feet, and churches and temples may be erected to a height not exceeding seventy-five (75) feet if the building is set back from each line at least one (1) foot for each foot of additional building height above the height limit otherwise provided in
 - Fences in front vards shall not exceed four (4) feet and fences in side and rear yards shall not exceed eight (8) feet in height. No barbed wire or electrically charged fences are allowed in a residential zone except for low voltage pet fences which must be located at least twelve (12) inches inside an exterior fence.

SECTION 3: That Article 1, Section <u>21-104</u>. R-2 - Two-Family Dwelling District be amended as follows:

21-104. R-2 - Two Family Dwelling District

- Height Regulations:
 - No building shall exceed two and one-half (2½) stories or thirty-five (35)
 - Fences in front yards shall not exceed four (4) feet and fences in side and rear yards shall not exceed eight (8) feet in height. No barbed wire or electrically charged fences are allowed in a residential zone except for low voltage pet fences which must be located at least twelve (12) inches inside an exterior fence.

SECTION 4: That Article 1, Section <u>21-105</u>. R-3 – Multiple Dwelling District be amended as follows

21-105. R-3 - Multiple Dwelling District

- Height Regulations:
 - No building shall exceed three and one-half (3½) stories or forty-five (45) feet in height.
- Public, semi-public or public service buildings, hospitals, institutions, or schools, when permitted in a district, may be erected to a height not exceeding sixty (60) feet, and churches and temples may be erected to a height not exceeding seventy-five (75) feet if the building is set back from each line at least one (1) foot for each foot of additional building height above the height limit otherwise provided in this district
- Fences in front yards shall not exceed four (4) feet and fences in side and rear yards shall not exceed eight (8) feet in height. No barbed wire or electrically charged fences are allowed in a residential zone except for low voltage pet fences which must be located at least twelve (12) inches inside an exterior fence.
