

Jayhawks prepared this year

AUBURN HILLS, Mich. (AP) started the season off poorly only to have been rolling. - Kansas only has one player in its regular rotation that saw significant playing time in last year's NCAA tournament.

Normally, that would be viewed as a bad thing. Not for the Jayhawks. Last year, senior-laden Kansas was stunned by 14th-seeded Bucknell in the first round. But reserve Jeff Hawkins is the only regular to see more than 10 minutes in the "Bucknell Bummer," as they call it in Kansas.

"I think that's good," freshman guard Mario Chalmers said. "A lot of people on the team now really didn't play on that team, so it's not on our minds right now. We're not even thinking about that game."

As if they needed any reminder, the Jayhawks (25-7), the fourth seed in the Oakland Regional, face another BU in the first round this year -13th-seeded Bradley (20-10).

At first blush, the two teams couldn't be more different.

Kansas has the storied pedigree, with 17 straight NCAA tournament appearances and 35 trips overall.

Located in Peoria, Ill., Bradley is making its eighth NCAA tourney appearance, but the first since 1996. And the Braves haven't won a tournament game since they beat 10thseeded UTEP in 1986.



Wichita Shockers win first round tourney game
