Some 354 people on 59 teams participated in this year's Walk Kansas Program,

For the second year in a row, shareholders of restaurant chain Applehumane way to slaughter chickens.

People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals asked the company to begin providing quarterly reports on its suppliers' development of "controlled atmosphere killing," or CAK, which euthanizes chickens by gradually replacing their oxygen with inert gases. Most slaughterhouses stun the

chickens with electricity, which PETA claims often leaves the birds still aware when their throats are slit and their feathers are removed in boiling water.
