Bikes, more prohibited on sidewalks

The City of Colby is reminding bicyclists and others riding related devices about the ordinances against riding on sidewalks and other walkways. According to the law, no person riding a bicycle, roller skates, skateboards, coasters, toy vehicles or similar devices are allowed to use sidewalks or

pedestrian walkways in the downtown business district. The ordinance addresses designated sidewalks and walkways in the area from Second Street to Sixth Street between Chickamauga Avenue and Lake Avenue and other locations designated by the council.
