CINCINNATI (AP) - Running back Clinton Portis partially dislocated his left shoulder during Washington's opening series of the preseason Sunday night, a significant setback for the Redskins' revamped offense.

An MRI test detected the injury, which involves the bone popping out of place temporarily in the shoulder socket. Standard treatment involves rest and strengthening exercises.

There was no immediate indication how long he will be sidelined. Portis started every game for the

Federer won the event when it was last played in Toronto in 2004


but didn't defend the title last year. The top-ranked Swiss captured his 40th career title, 11th in the Masters Series.
