Farmers, ag experts embrace new methods, technologies to deal with global warming

DES MOINES, Iowa (AP) — Gary Larsen, who grows corn and soybeans in western Iowa, is among a growing number of farmers who are concerned about the potential effects of global warming.

Like Larsen, many in the agriculture industry are developing or adopting new technologies and farming methods to brace for the possibility of widespread drought and crop-pounding storms.

The industry has been especially aggressive in breeding and developing crops that more efficiently use soil moisture and nutrients and developing pest-resistant and drought-tolerant crops.

"We don't know how the world could actually turn out, but doing absolutely nothing and sticking your head in the sand is not an option," said Larsen, a 63-year-old

Washington state farmers back property-rights measure

OLYMPIA, Wash. (AP) -Roger Reaves isn't planning to turn his 126 acres of chickens, cattle and Christmas trees into a sprawling housing development anytime

But when county officials decided that homes in his area should be separated by 20 acres instead of five, Reaves still felt the sting.

Now, if Reaves' children and grandchildren find themselves in a pinch, they'll get far less money for selling the family spread, the longtime Tenino farmer said.

"One of the things my parents instilled into me was, 'Son, if you take something that's not yours, you're going to be held accountable," Reaves said. "To be quite honest with you, local and state government doesn't feel that."

Complaints like Reaves' are at the heart of Initiative 933, a property-rights measure being considered by Washington voters.

The initiative would require state and local government agencies to either compensate private landowners for regulations that harm the value of private property, or waive

The state Farm Bureau is the most vocal public supporter of the initiative, saying it will help guard against heavy-handed government regulations that could drive down property values and make farms and ranches unprofitable.

"We're just saying that if government has taken rights away from you in the last 10 years and you can show it, then they ought to be accountable to respect those rights," Farm Bureau spokesman Dan by New York real-estate mogul and Wood said. "It's not a big, scary concept.'

Opponents, however, say the measures elsewhere. measure could compromise critical environmental protections and open up rural areas to voracious largest donations coming from The housing developers. I-933 and its counterparts elsewhere follow the lead of Oregon, where residents in 2004 enacted a law forcing government to pay private property owners for regulations that harm land values.

Washington state supporters say their measure has key differences, but critics say the two measures are close enough to make Oregon's \$4 billion in claims a striking lesson.

The pro-initiative campaign has raised nearly \$800,000. Its largest contributor is Americans for Limited Government, a group headed conservative activist Howard Rich, who has helped bankroll similar

Initiative opponents have raised more than \$2.6 million, with the Nature Conservancy. Wealthy local people, including Aldus Corp. founder Paul Brainerd and donated to the cause.
