Jayhawks' collapse continues

LAWRENCE (AP) — It is becoming all too familiar to Kansas coach Mark Mangino, his players and Javhawk fans.

Nearly every week Kansas manages to build a big second-half lead, only to allow its opponent to climb back into the game. Four of its five losses have been second-half collapses, including each of the past

And each time, the meltdown is worse than the week before.

"If I had an explanation," Mangino said, "we would've corrected it awhile back, wouldn't

The most recent loss came Saturday against Baylor, where Kansas played nearly perfect on offense and built a 35-17 lead by halftime.

But in the second half, an offense that had been averaging better than 7 yards per play didn't manage a single point, while the porous Jayhawk secondary continued to give up big plays to Baylor quarterback Shawn Bell.

He set a school record with 394 yards passing and five touchdowns, three in the final 9:22, as the Bears erased an 18-point fourth-quarter lead in a 36-35 victory. It was enough to earn Bell Big 12 offensive player of the week honors.

"I really felt like we sort of lost our edge going into the second half," said running back Jon Cornish, moments after the third-biggest collapse in school history. "We weren't really coming out to win, we were trying to keep our lead.
