





Opening lead — queen of spades.

Reward for Good Behavior

Assume you're declarer at four hearts and West leads the spade queen.

It's dollars to doughnuts East has the ace of spades, so you follow low from dummy, hoping he was dealt the singleton or doubleton ace.

Sure enough, East wins the queen with the ace — proving the ace was singleton and shifts to a club at trick two.

You're still not out of the woods after you win the club with dummy's king. If you lead a trump now, there's the danger that West will win with the ace and return the jack of spades, and East will ruff the king. If that occurs — and you'd have to be somewhat unlucky for all this to happen — you'd eventually go down one, since you'd be left with a spade loser.

So you don your thinking cap at trick three and look for a means of saving the contract if West was actually dealt the singleton ace of trumps and East the other two trumps. That's the only combination of cards that can stop you from making four hearts.

And, as you think about it, the solution suddenly dawns on you. Even if the situation is as you fear, there's a sure way out of the dilemma. Accordingly, after winning the club return, you cash the A-K of diamonds, the ace of clubs, and then ruff a club in dummy. Now, having eliminated all your minor-suit cards from both hands, you lead a trump.

West wins with the ace and returns the jack of spades to dummy's king, and, sure enough, East ruffs.

But as a direct result of your early spadework, poor East must now return a diamond or a club. This allows you to discard your spade loser as you trump in dummy, and the contract is saved.
