Holiday gift cards: Treasurer warns sometimes they are no a gift for anyone

TOPEKA — With the expected card or certificate. increase in gift card sales this holiday season, Kansas State Treasurer Lynn Jenkins, CPA warns Kansans this holiday season as it will not go who plan to purchase gift cards to be aware of possible fees and card expiration dates which can take effect as early as six months after the purchase dates.

Recent legislation passed by violation of the Kansas Consumer Protection Act to sell a gift card or gift certificate containing an expiration date less than five years from the date of purchase and also prevents merchants from charging a fee within 12 months of issuing the

The law does not impact gift cards and certificates purchased for into affect until Jan. 1, 2007.

"Kansans need to make sure they understand the policies that govern gift cards," said State Treasurer "Also take notice of the various

Kansas lawmakers will make it a transaction, service, inactivity and convenience fees that may be imposed on the cards that could result in decreased monetary value." "Kansans need to be cautious and

State Treasurer Jenkins urges citizens to use gift cards as soon as possible to reduce the chances of the cards being lost, stolen, or becoming expired.

She also said that Kansans should carefully read the policies of each business from whom they purchase gift cards because many gift cards have restrictions or service fees that reduce their value over time.

Jenkins, a former State Representative and Senator from Topeka,

Kansas State Treasurer on Nov. 7.


