Creation of an Illusion

Most decisions made at the table are clear-cut. You have an obvious bid or play to make, and you make it with much thought.

But there are times when it is not at all clear what you should do. These are the times when good judgment is the deciding factor and when the failure to guess right can prove fatal.

Consider the South hand, for example. What should South bid after East's overcall of four spades? In the actual deal, he bid five hearts. Apparently, South was more intent upon scoring a vulnerable game than he was upon taking the sure profit he could collect by doubling four spades. Had we been in his boots, we would have doubled.

West led a spade, East cashing the A-K before shifting to a diamond. Declarer won with the king and led the queen of hearts, West following low. South was sufficiently inspired to play the ace, catching East's king. Had we been in his boots, we would have finessed and gone down one.

After drawing two more rounds of trumps, declarer led a low club from dummy and finessed the queen, on which West dropped the nine. South fell for the falsecard, deciding that West had started with the 10-9 alone.

Accordingly, he crossed to dummy with a diamond and led the jack of clubs, hoping to pin East's king and West's ten on the same trick and thus make dummy's eight high. This was a fatal decision, and South went down one, eventually losing a club to the ten. Had he led the five instead of the jack, he would have made the contract.

South's play of the jack was clearly wrong. If he had first cashed his remaining diamond, he would have learned that East had started with three diamonds, a heart, seven spades (for his bid) and, hence, exactly two clubs. A low club lead from dummy was therefore bound to catch the king.
