



## Famous Hand

Many years ago, a British Columbia team journeyed to nearby Seattle to play a team-of-eight match against a Pacific Northwest team. The U.S. team won the 64board match by 4,240 points.

One deal produced a startling series of results and indicates how bridge play minds run in different channels.

At one of the four tables, the bidding v as shown. The U.S. South reached clubs doubled. North redoubled, and clarer then took all the tricks for a scor 1,150 points.

A heart was led to dummy's ace, and clarer cashed the ace of spades, discard the jack of hearts. After playing the ac diamonds, South led a low trump to nine. He then ruffed a diamond, finessed ten of clubs, repeated the finesse to his and cashed the ace, catching East's ki When the diamonds turned out to be vided 3-3, the Canadian defenders wo up with no tricks to show for their dou

At the second table, something v strange occurred. All four players pass Apparently, the U.S. North thought hand was not good enough to open (only high-card points), and South, lacking majors and holding only 11 high-c points, also passed. Thus, North-Sc never bid on a hand on which they co make a grand slam!

At the third table, the U.S. West opened three spades, which every body passed! This was easily made, as the Canadian pair at this table also didn't utter a peep.

At the fourth table, the U.S. West also opened three spades. After two passes, South decided to put up a fight. He bid four diamonds, which everyone passed, and some how went down two for a loss of 100 points.

Altogether, the U.S. team gained 1,390 points on the deal, but would have fared even better if at one table it had not passed out a hand on which it could make a grand slam!
