Trojan qualify for nationals

The Colby Community College indoor track and field team qualified individuals for the NJCAA Indoor championships Saturday and Sunday in Lubbock, Texas.

Overall, the Lady Trojans finished fourth as a team for the Jayhawk West and finished seventh in the region. The men also placed fourth for the Jayhawk West and 10th in the region.

Ivan Guel and Ashley Murphy both qualified in the weight throw for the Trojans. Murphy reached the national qualifying mark with a throw of 42-8 and also was the Jayhawk West Champion with the throw. Guel set a new school record on the men's side with a nationally qualifying throw of 49-1 and finished second in the Jayhawk West.

"We had a great region indoor meet," head coach Jeff Becker said. "We had a lot of season and personal bests. I would have liked to place higher as a team, but figuring the winter we had, I was pleased with the finish."

Betty Rotich, who previously hit national qualifying marks, was named the women's track athlete of the meet for winning the 3k and 5k races. Rotich also established a new Region VI record in the 5k race.
