They're sexually promiscuous, but that's hardly love. Do you have any clues about the why of this? — E.D.

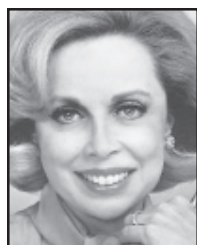
**Dear E.D.:** My own views are merely opinions based on my own observations, not necessarily on any scientific studies.

# Shocker: Bad news turns good on wheat

What's being labeled the Easter freeze of '07 hammered most of the eastern two-thirds of Kansas while the western third may have escaped. Heavy damage occurred in central and eastern Kansas because the wheat was growing rapidly, lush with moisture and ahead of schedule — in some cases the winter crop had developed two joints already. Heavy cloud cover and not as cold temperatures helped stave off freeze in western Kansas.

McPherson and Marion counties appear to be an area of central Kansas hit the hardest.

Here growth of the main tillers was killed outright by the frost and severe lodging has occurred. Even in fields in this part of the state where the crop remains standing the end result may be the same.

"That result will probably be a severely damaged wheat crop," said Ron Seyfert, district extension agent in Ottawa County. Ottawa and Saline counties hosted a wheat freeze injury tour April 23.

"This crop will be nowhere near the promising crop we saw before the 16 and 18 degree temperatures hit.

"We had the promise of a 60-bushel crop and now we're facing the prospect of yields in the 12-20 bushel range.

"I hope we're on the high end, but that'll take ideal growing condi-

tions from here on out."

And that's what has producers loosing sleep at night — trying to decide whether to leave this wheat crop in the field, destroy it or plant another crop and move on. It's a roll of the dice.

This scenario has Kansas wheat producers in a quandary. In some areas of the state hardest hit like south-central Kansas, the crop is already being destroyed. In other areas, Ottawa and Saline counties, producers haven't made up their minds yet.

According to Jim Shroyer, Kansas State University extension state leader of agronomy, there are so many factors to consider.

Certain herbicides may limit what a farmer can plant should he destroy this damaged crop. Grain sorghum may be a possibility — STS (sulfonylurea chemical tolerant) soybeans another.

The question then becomes, can the farmer get his hands on the seed to plant one of these crops?

Other producers may be faced with filling a contract to produce wheat.

What kind of insurance a producer has, and when the company will release the crop, is another consideration for producers.

"It's still early," Shroyer says. "We still have several weeks to make a decision. It's essential that producers take stock of their individual fields. They need to find out how many tillers are there and then

make a decision."

The KSU agronomist says if a producer has approximately 30 percent of the tillers intact the crop may go either way.

If a producer has 50 percent or more of the stems still surviving, Shroyer suggests keeping the crop.

Ottawa County farmer Steve Clanton who farms one mile north and three miles west of Minneapolis says he plans to make a decision this week.

"It all hinges on seed availability and how much wheat potential you think you have out there," Clanton said. "Whichever way you go it's a gamble."

Kansas Agricultural Statistics Service reported April 23 that only 27 percent of the state's winter wheat crop escaped freeze damage, and that the remaining wheat suffered far more than had been feared.

The agency estimated freeze damage to the Kansas crop as 29 percent severe, 24 percent moderate and 20 percent light.

The new condition report pegged 41 percent of this season's winter wheat as being in poor to very poor. Conditions for the rest of this year's wheat: 25 percent fair, 24 percent good and 10 percent excellent.

# Casinos three years from reality

TOPEKA (AP) — The Lottery Commission took the first step Wednesday toward having four resort casinos in Kansas, but it could be three years before any of them will be opening their doors.

Acting under the gambling law that took effect last month, the five-member commission unanimously agreed the clock would start running on the 90 days for accepting casino applications after certification of county elections that are required for a community to host a casino.

The commission then will have another 90 days to negotiate contracts with aspiring casino managers for the state and forward them to a yet-to-be-formed, seven-member review board.

The review board has 60 days to pick the four casino managers and send those names to the state Racing and Gaming Commission for final approval.

Ed Van Petten, lottery executive director, said the timetable for sifting through applications and coming up with proposed contracts could be extended by Gov. Kathleen Sebelius if there's a flood of applicants.

"I don't think it'll be a major problem," Van Petten said. "If we get more than anticipated, the governor has said she'd rather do it right than do it quick."

Absent any glitches, such as delays in getting applications approved, lawsuits or court rulings, casino construction could start next year.

"At the absolute minimum we're talking about a couple of years and realistically three years to get in full operation," Van Petten said.

But Sebelius said during a news conference that she's skeptical that potential managers will want to submit applications until legal issues surrounding the new law are settled. The Prairie Band Potawatomi Nation, which operates a northeast Kansas casino, has threatened to challenge the law.

"I can't imagine many investment groups willing to put up \$250 million-plus until they know if this law is going to stand up," she said. "We're really 50 steps away from somebody making an application."

The American Gaming Association says 11 other states have commercial casinos but none with state-run resort casinos like Kansas will have.

Twenty-eight states have Indian gambling — 23, including Kansas, with casinos and five with games such as bingo.

The law allows one casino each

in Wyandotte and Ford counties, a southeast Kansas zone of Crawford and Cherokee counties and a south-central zone of Sedgwick and Sumner counties.

Cherokee County's election is June 5, Wyandotte and Ford counties' on June 26 and Sedgwick County on Aug. 7.

Crawford and Sumner counties already have approved casinos, and Van Petten said those votes probably would be counted, avoiding a second vote. In the two zones, the deadline clock starts after the second election is certified.

Van Petten said the lottery's primary focus on negotiating contracts will be what's best for the state and what will best benefit the areas where the casinos will be located.

The commission also approved an eight-page document spelling out what's required of applicants, including sufficient financial resources to meet the minimum investment requirement, at least three years of experience managing casinos and all taxes paid.
