Conveniences danger without some caution

Dear Readers: **Electric garage doors** are a wonderful convenience, but they can also be a danger. Taking the time to test the door every few months can be a true lifesaver. Here are some important safety hints if you have an electric garage door:

- Make sure the door will reverse within two seconds after coming in contact with someone or something.

To test this, lay a couple of paper-towel rolls or a two-by-four flat on the floor directly under the door so that the ends are pointing straight in and out of the garage. Then activate the door opener.

The garage door should reverse as soon as it hits the objects — if it doesn't, disconnect it until it can be adjusted and then test it again.

- Have the door inspected by a professional every so often to check for wear and tear that could affect the door's speed and sensitivity.
- Keep remote controls away from children.
- Teach children by example by not attempting to run out of the garage as the door is on the way down.
