The CHS Forensics team had another successful season, qualifying fifteen entries for state festival and nine entries for the state championship tournament.

"Although our Forensics team is young, they have shown tremendous growth and a willingness to learn and try new things.

"Our team did well at State Forensics and State Festival, and the coaching staff is looking forward to facilitating the journey to future successful seasons," said Mrs. Giersch, head forensics coach.

State festival is similar to a music festival, in that, the performer performs one time and is rated from one to five. To qualify for festival, one must either get a "I" rating at regional festival or place in the top five at any tournament. State cham-

pionship tournament has three preliminary rounds, and the top twelve from the prelims are taken into semifinals.

After semifinals, the average scores are taken and the top six advance to finals. To get to state champs, you must place in the top two, or sometimes top three, competitors in an invitational tournament.
