Tips offered on removing candle wax drips

Dear Readers: Candles add a lovely light to a dining-room table, holiday centerpiece or just on a mantel. However, many candles can leave an ugly mess if candle wax drips on a tablecloth or even the carpet.

First, try to keep candles in holders with bobeches to contain that melting wax. Then, if wax lands where it shouldn't, try the following hints:

put it into the freezer for several days until the wax hardens and dries out, then carefully scrape the wax off with a dull knife. Place paper towels on both sides of the stain and turn on the iron to a warm setting. Press over the stain to absorb all of the wax. Note:

• On carpeting, freeze by putting a metal pan filled with ice cubes over the wax spill. When hardened, take a small hammer and hit to break up, then vacuum up the pieces. A little left? Cover it with paper towels and press with an iron set on a warm setting. Still a stain? Apply a bit of dry-cleaning solvent to a clean white cloth and blot the stain until removed.
