Neighbors sat on their front porches tapping their feet and clapping their hands to the sounds of a fiddle, banjo and bones. The Free Staters combine fiddle, early fretless banjo, parlor guitar, and buffalo bones to recreate the music you would have heard coming from an American front porch in the 1940s. The Free Staters, who dress in period clothing, include Betsey Goering who plays the fiddle and began playing the instrument at age 3. Her violin was made at the turn of the 20th century. She was classically trained for 14 years
