## Lady Trojan golfer makes the cut

All three members of the Colby Community College women's golf team competed at the National Golf Championship's in Daytona Beach, Fla., May 12-15.

Freshman Abby Laverenz emerged as the only Region VI individual qualifier to make the cut.

Laverenz, from Burlington, Colo., shot a combined 54-hole score of 273 (98, 89, 86).

"We were very pleased with Abby's performance," said Lady Trojan head coach Lisa Stithem. "Abby had a disappointing first round, but was able to bounce back the next two days."

Sophomore Veronica Forsythe

from Brush, Colo., and freshman Eryn Topliff from Goodland both failed to make the cut after two days of play, but both girls cut strokes off their first day rounds.

The championship was hosted by Daytona Beach College and played on the LPGA International Golf Course.

Tournament play was delayed by one day due to wild brush fires that came dangerously close to the course and the LPGA residential subdivision thereby reducing the 72-hole tournament to a 54-hole tournament.

Next season, Laverenz is the only Lady Trojan scheduled to be

back.

Forsythe is checking out golfing opportunities at transfer schools, while Topliff has been accepted to the Colby College nursing program.

"It was a wonderful opportunity and a good experience for all three girls to compete at the national level," said Stithem.

"We look forward to next year's competition and we will be relying on Abby to lead the way for Trojan women's golf."

Laverenz will be joined by freshman recruits Eva DeLuca, Yuma, Colo., Megan Martin, Oakley, and Megan Ryan, Oakley.

## Royals swept out of Fenway Park

BOSTON (AP)- The Red Sox made winning look easy at Fenway Park the past few days.

A no-hitter, two grand slams in a game and two pitchers coming up from Triple-A to get wins — it couldn't have gone much better in a four-game sweep of Kansas City.

J.D. Drew and Mike Lowell

supplied the slams Thursday to help Daisuke Matsuzaka remain unbeaten, and Boston completed a perfect seven-game homestand with an 11-8 win over the Royals.

The series started with Jon Lester's no-hitter on Monday and closed with Lowell and Drew joining the club's record books. It was just the fourth time Boston

has had two slams in a game at home.

"Everybody feels like they're doing something for us, and they are," Boston manager Terry Francona said.

After Lester's gem, Justin Masterson and Bartolo Colon were called up from Pawtucket and picked up wins.

"It closed a nice homestand for us," Lowell said. "The thing I like most is we plugged two new guys in."

Drew and Lowell were the first to hit slams in the same game at Fenway since Tony Armas and Bill Buckner did it Aug. 7, 1984.

The last time Boston had two slams in a game was when the switch-hitting Bill Mueller hit both — one from each side —.

## Trojan named top freshman

Scott Hornstra was a virtual unknown in local baseball circles only a few months back.

By the end of the season, the Colby Trojan freshman first baseman had gained the attention of every coach in the Jayhawk Conference.

Hornstra, a native of Alberta, Calgary, Canada, became the first Colby player in head coach Ryan Carter's 10 years at the school to be named the Western Division Freshman of Year.

Hornstra was also named to the All-Region team and made First-Team All-Conference after finishing third for the Trojans in average (.388) and second in RBIs (48), hits (76) and home runs (seven).

"I'm definitely excited for him," said Carter. "Putting up the numbers he did all year long this year puts a lot of pressure on him next year to have the same type of season."

Because of injuries, Hornstra emerged as Colby's fourth starter and filled in admirably. He finished with a 5-2 record and a 3.04 ERA.

His five wins tied him with Mark Phillips for the team lead and his 3.04 ERA was top's among Colby's starters.

Also earning First-Team All-Conference recognition was sophomore leftfielder Aaron Dunsmore, who also happens to hail from Alberta.

Dunsmore led the team with a .414 average, 14 home runs and 55 RBIs.

He hit a school-record 23 doubles, led the team in runs scored with 55 and had the highest on-base percentage of any Trojan regular (.495).

"He was definitely a power threat every single game we played," said Carter.

"People knew his name and he was still able to put up big numbers. We knew he was capable of doing it, and it was fun to see him prove us right."

Dunsmore has signed with the University of Dayton next year.

Sophomore Steve Kletke, a Grambling University signee, earned Second-Team All-Conference honors.

Kletke, from Altona, Manitoba, Canada, had to DH this year because of a bad knee, but still hit .407 with four home runs and 45 RBIs.

"If his knee would have stayed healthy, there's no doubt he would have made a run for conference MVP," said Carter. "He gave us a quality at-bat every single time so I can't complain."

The Trojans finished the season fifth in the West with a 25-30 record after losing in three games to Kansas City, Kan., Community College in the first round of the Region VI playoffs.
