Higher gas, food prices changing vacations

KANOPOLIS LAKE (AP) Jane Darling admitted she had other plans for her Memorial Day a trip to Illinois to visit her grandchildren.

However, she didn't hesitate to take off for a weekend at the lake.

As storms moved in on Sunday afternoon and her arms a little pink from too much sun, the Alden-area woman and her family spent the day on a boat in the middle of Kanopolis Lake before heading back to the cabin for a night of storm watching and grilling.

"It would have cost us \$500 to go to Illinois," she said. "This is so much cheaper.'

It's the first big holiday of the year, and the first real weekend temperatures have even felt summery. And it's the first time Kansans have encountered nearly \$4 gas prices at the pump.

So many, like Darling, flocked to the lake, despite the fact it costs more to make the trip and fill up to boat. It even costs more to barbecue.

The result is fewer vacations and forward thinking before planning a trip. And for many, they're just not traveling very far.

"You just don't know what will happen," Cheney State Park Manager Jody Schwartz said of whether those area travelers will find haven at a local lake or somewhere else. "We're hoping people will come out here instead of going to Table Rock or down to Oklahoma or somewhere else.'

Despite a decent weekend turnout, state park officials are wondering just what the season will

Already visitors are telling Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks staff that they don't know how much they'll bring out the boat this year, said State Park Director Jerry Hover.

These days, it costs more than \$93 to fill up a 25-gallon fuel tank on a boat, up roughly 35 percent from a year ago. In 2000, the cost

was just \$37.50. These factors could cause some

We're concerned about it," Hover said. "It could have a detrimental effect."

to rethink summer plans.

Those who do go camping this year will not just have a higher gas bill. This year, the average cost to grill has jumped more than 35 percent, according to figures provide by the Consumer Price Index. Hot dogs jumped 7 percent. A 2-liter pop and a bag of chips both have jumped 10 percent. Even a case of beer is higher.

"One thing in our favor is that at least 70 percent or more of our visitations comes from Kansas," Hover said. "Maybe we can keep them in Kansas this year instead of going to Colorado or someplace else.'

They call them "stay-cations" and these close-to-home trips are what many tourist officials are banking on.

promise at Kanopolis, where trucks and boat slips packed the South Shore boat dock parking lot. Others flocked to a nearby beach across the way.

"If there is a gas price problem, I'm not seeing it here," said Pat McCann, who was running a park pay booth with her husband, Dexter. "We've seen a lot of boats, a lot of all-terrain vehicles."

Park officials did cut park vehicle permits in half last year to \$4.20 a day in an effort to increase visitors. A new geocaching game - a treasure hunt using global position system, also is drawing some to state parks.

Still, he said. "I've seen a few big boats for sale this season."

Jennifer Krob of Lindsborg. who sat outside at the beach with Chad Jennings of Salina on Sunday, said she probably wouldn't forgo a trip to the lake. However, she isn't planning a family vacation this year.

"We're watching every trip," said Krob, adding that she shops in bulk to save on trips to the grocery store. "You think twice before you go somewhere now." But some activity, including

even the expense of running a boat at the lake, will be a little harder to give up.

Jane Darling's sister-in-law, Donna Darling, also of Alden, said the lake will be the family vacation this year.

"We'd like to go to Kansas City, Worlds of Fun, but you can't afford to go," she said. "It's cheaper to come to the lake than take a vacation."
