

A LARGELY OVERLOOKED **BIRTH DEFECT RISK**

While many women of reproductive age take prescription medications that can cause birth defect, only half of them receive contraceptive counseling. According to recent research on the subject, it was found that one American women in six of reproductive age has filled a prescription for a medication that is labeled by the FDA as having an increased risk for causing fetal abnormalities. Yet, there was little difference in the rates of contraceptive counseling, contraception use, or subsequent pregnancy test results when women took the medications associated with birth defects versus safer medications. Once women are apprised of the risk, they should understand that not all contraception methods are equally effective, and then choose the most appropriate one.






