

She also touched on the 34-35 percent of the students who don't go on to post-secondary institutions and how we are meeting their needs. ## Lottery sales down

TOPEKA (AP) — Like most states dealing with the troubled economy, Kansas is seeing a decline in lottery ticket sales as more people are pinching pennies even Ed Van Petten, Kansas Lottery

executive director, said Wednesday that ticket sales between July 1 and last Saturday were down 4 percent over the same period last year, amounting to about \$2 million. He said the state sells about \$20 million in lottery tickets a month.

He said Kansas mirrors the other 41 states with lotteries.

"Nobody is growing like they were three years ago and most are off a little bit," Van Petten said.
