

Sisters dominate league meet Saturday







Eagles take on Vikings without star

College to honor wrestler at tourney

Colby Community College will be honoring its most famous wrestler next weekend when it hosts the first annual Daniel Cormier Open wrestling tournament at the Colby Community Building on Saturday,

Adults will pay \$ 10 to admittance, and students \$5.

The tournament will include athletes from two-year and fouryear colleges across the Midwest.

While attending Colby College in 1998 and 1999, Cormier won National Junior College Athletic Association championships twice and never lost to a junior college opponent. In 1999, he led the wrestling team to the only Division 1 national championship the college has ever won in any sport. After leaving Colby, Cormier the open as of Friday.

went on to become a Division 1 All-American with Oklahoma State University. He was an eight time national champion and made the U.S. Olympic team twice.

"We are so fortunate to boast that Colby Community College was the launching site for the amazing ... career of Daniel Cormier," said wrestling Coach Steve Lampe.

Cormier will be present for the tournament and will be making a presentation at 6 p.m. at the community building.

"This will be a great event to attend," Lampe said. "Wrestlers of all ages will greatly benefit by listening to Daniel's amazing story."

Cormier will be available for autographs and pictures after he finishes his presentation, said Debbie Schwanke, college public information director.


