Corrections

An article in the Wednesday, Nov. 13, Colby Free Press about the Thomas County commissioners, "County caps and expense pleas," incorrectly stated that the commissioners voted to put a \$300 cap on department spending without special permission. The \$300 maximum spending cap adopted last week was actually for central purchasing, said Thomas County Deputy Clerk Susan Guill. Once a year, the departments can give an office supply order to the clerk's office. These supplies are paid for from a central purchasing fund. Commissioners ruled that the departments can ask for no more than \$300 in supplies. This error resulted at least partly from confusion and misinformation about the motion.


