Consumers spend billions Booking Log of dollars each year on service contracts and warranties. These agreements offer peace of mind from repair hassles, but can end up costing more than the value of the coverage.

When contemplating whether or not to purchase an extended warranty, take time to read the small print and review the terms and conditions the manufacturer's warranty already covers.

Use the tips below to protect your investment this season:

• Most electronics and appliances include a manufacturer's warranty that covers the parts and service for a year. Compare the manufacturer's coverage to the store service agreement to determine if it is worth the extra expense.

• Find out what repairs are covered and whether this includes "abuse, misuse or wear and tear"; all terms that may be subject to the interpretation of the merchant issuing the service plan.

• Determine standard repair costs. Sometimes, repairs cost the same amount as the service contract.

• Find out where you can receive service and if there are contract
