Jayhawks take on Gophers, look for second straight win

SCOTTSDALE, Ariz. (AP) in back-to-back bowl games for the first time in school history, but coach Mark Mangino is keeping the milestone in perspective.

"We're still a work in progress," the seventh-year head coach said Monday in Scottsdale, where Kansas is preparing for Wednesday's Insight Bowl game against Minnesota at Tempe. "We haven't arrived. There is no great destination for us. We just keep at it all the time and keep working at it and getting better.

"We are starting to see the results of the hard work that has been put forth by our players, the players before them and our coaching staff, but there is a lot of work to be done at Kansas."

The Kansas Jayhawks are playing Big 12 play during Mangino's first to do here, to make this program season in 2002. The Insight Bowl will be their fourth bowl appearance since then, a record of progress that hit a high point last year with a 12-1 finish and a victory over Virginia Tech in the Orange Bowl.

> A win over the Golden Gophers (7-5) on Wednesday would give the Jayhawks a total of 20 victories over two seasons.

"Everything at Kansas has come in steps," Mangino said. "Nothing has been very easy. We've gone in steps, and this is just another step for our program.

"We certainly would like to finish our season on a high note and get our eighth win," he added. "It would make 20 wins in two sea- Fox.
