Eagles put a beating on Tigers

The Colby High boys basketball team pummeled Ulysses 62-35 in the first round of the orange and black classic. The win improved the Eagles record to 7-3 on the season.

Colby was simply too powerful for Ulysses. Senior Levi Schlick was able to get high percentage shots right around the basket all game long. Ulysses just didn't have anyone who could stop him.

Colby led the Ulysses 16-8 at the end of the first quarter. The Eagles widened their lead in the second quarter. Schlick was able to muscle to hoop for a couple buckets. Sophomore Corbin Stephens made a terrific hustle play during the quarter.

Stephens missed a short jumper

and hustled back on defense where he intercepted a pass. He passed the ball off to Schlick who took the ball down court before hitting senior Brent Arnberger with a nice bounce pass that he laid off the glass while drawing contact from a Tiger defender. The Eagles shut the Tigers offense down in the second quarter by not allowing them to have any easy shots. Ulysses was only able to score two points in the quarter.

Near the end of the second quarter senior Cade Carter sent a bullet pass that whizzed past Ulysses defenders into the waiting arms of senior Corey Sager who laid in a uncontested lay-up to give Colby a 26-10 lead. This would remain the score when the buzzer sounded to signal the beginning of halftime.

The Eagles continued widening their lead in the third quarter. Senior Stephen Dinkel nailed a

three to give Colby a 43-14 lead with three minutes remaining in the quarter. Dinkel scored again nice driving lay-up to extend the Eagles lead to 54-16 with 30 seconds left in the period.

Coach Beau Sheets let his starters rest for most of the fourth quarter. Senior Tyson Miller made the most of his extra minutes by scoring six points.

Levi Schlick had a double-double scoring a team-high 20 points and pulling down 11 rebounds. Stephen Dinkel scored 11 points and Carter added nine points. Carter was 3-5 from three point range in the game. The Eagles were very efficient on offense in the second half making a little over 55 percent of their shots.

The Eagles will take on Scott City at 6:30 p.m. tonight at the Colby Community Building.

Colby wins sixth in a row

The Colby High girls basketball team overcame a slow start and went on to defeat Scott City 35-33 on Thursday in the first round of the 24th annual Paul Wintz/Tom Bowen Orange and Black Basketball Classic.

The Lady Eagles looked like they were on their way to having a rough night in the first quarter. They looked out of rhythm and off balance. They made poor decisions and they just couldn't seem to put the ball in the bucket. Scott City led 9-0 at the end of the first quarter.

They managed to recover from their abysmal start in the second quarter. Senior Taylor Young scored the team's first point with an unguarded layup. The basket seemed to bring renewed vigor to the team as they started playing with an extra bounce in their step.

Sophomore Katherine Kaus' impressive play on both sides of the court really provided a spark for the team in the second quarter. Kaus was everywhere on the court stealing the ball, intercepting passes, blocking shots and scoring points. When halftime arrived the Eagles only trailed the Lady Beavers 16-15.

The game remained close throughout the third period. A Scott City player drilled a three at the very end of the quarter to give the Lady Beavers a 30-25 lead.

The start of the fourth quarter looked like a carbon copy of the third quarter. Both teams played tough defense while struggling offensively. Whenever the Lady Eagles looked poised to take the lead and secure a victory they would

commit a turnover or the Lady Beavers would make a shot.

But with less than three minutes remaining in the game Colby was able to pick up its play and come through in the clutch.

The Eagles trailed by four when sophomore Shelby Terrell was fouled near the Lady Beavers basket. She sank both of her free throws to cut Scott City's lead to 30-28. A little later in the game Terrell managed to get open near the basket for a wide open layup that tied the game at 30. Moments later Katherine picked off a Lady Beaver pass and took it down the court until she was fouled by a defender while attempting a layup. Kaus drained both free throws to put Colby up by two with less than a minute to go in the game.

A little later in the game a Scott City player got a decent look from three point range that rimmed in and out. Sophomore Kayla Hockersmith grabbed the rebound and was immediately hacked. Hockersmith stepped to the line looking to redeem herself after missing two free throws on the Lady Eagles' previous possession. She came through knocking down both free throws to extend Colby's lead to 34-30.

Unfortunately for the Lady Eagles Scott City was not ready to

wave the white flag. On their next possession a Lady Beaver player would make a shot right around the basket while drawing contact. She buried her free throw to cut Colby's lead to one.

Hockersmith was immediately fouled on the next possession. She knocked down 1 of 2 free throws to give the Lady Eagles a 35-33 lead with six seconds remaining in the game.

Scott City called a timeout after Hockersmith knocked down her second free throw attempt. When action resumed a Scott City player dribbled the ball down the sideline when she was whistled for traveling. Moments later Hockersmith was called for traveling. Luckily for the Lady Eagles Hockersmith traveled with less than a second remaining in the game. The Lady Beavers inbound passer threw a pass that sailed over her teammates head and Colby picked up their sixth win in a row.

Katherine had a team-high 12 points and Young added 10 points. Young grabbed nine rebounds leaving her one rebound shy of a double-double.

Colby will take on Flint Hills at 8:15 p.m. tonight at the Community Building.
