# Colby wins sixth in a row

The Colby High girls basketball team overcame a slow start and went on to defeat Scott City 35-33 on Thursday in the first round of the 24th annual Paul Wintz/Tom Bowen Orange and Black Basketball Classic.

The Lady Eagles looked like they were on their way to having a rough night in the first quarter. They looked out of rhythmn and off balance. They made poor decisions and they just couldn't seem to put the ball in the bucket. Scott City led 9-0 at the end of the first

They managed to recover from their abysmal start in the second quarter. Senior Taylor Young scored the team's first point with an unguarded layup. The basket seemed to bring renewed vigor to the team as they started playing with an extra bounce in their step.

Sophomore Katherine Kaus' impressive play on both sides of the court really provided a spark for the team in the second quarter. Kaus was everywhere on the court stealing the ball, intercepting passes, blocking shots and scoring points. When halftime arrived the Eagles only trailed the Lady Beavers 16-15.

The game remained close throughout the third period. A Scott City player drilled a three at the very end of the quarter to give the Lady Beavers a 30-25 lead.

The Eagles trailed by four when sophomore Shelby Terrell was fouled near the Lady Beavers basket. She sank both of her free throws to cut Scott City's lead to 30-28. A little later in the game Terrell managed to get open near the basket for a wide open layup that tied the game at 30. Moments later Katherine picked off a Lady Beaver pass and took it down the court until she was fouled by a defender while attempting a layup. Kaus drained both free throws to put Colby up by two with less than a minute to go in the game.

A little later in the game a Scott City player got a decent look from three point range that rimmed in and out. Sophomore Kayla Hockersmith grabbed the rebound and was immediately hacked. Hockersmith stepped to the line looking to redeem herself after missing two free throws on the Lady Eagles' previous possession. She came through knocking down both free throws to extend Colby's lead to 34-30.

Unfortunately for the Lady Eagles Scott City was not ready to

commit a turnover or the Lady wave the white flag. On their next possession a Lady Beaver player would make a shot right around the basket while drawing contact. She buried her free throw to cut

Colby's lead to one. Hockersmith was immediately fouled on the next possession. She knocked down 1 of 2 free throws to give the Lady Eagles a 35-33 lead with six seconds remaining in the game.

Scott City called a timeout after Hockersmith knocked down her second free throw attempt. When action resumed a Scott City player dribbled the ball down the sideline when she was whistled for traveling. Moments later Hockersmith was called for traveling. Luckily for the Lady Eagles Hockersmith traveled with less then a second remaining in the game. The Lady Beavers inbound passer threw a pass that sailed over her teammates head and Colby picked up their sixth win in a row.

Katherine had a team-high 12 points and Young added 10 points. Young grabbed nine rebounds leaving her one rebound shy of a double-double.


