"Sandzen taught lithographing, oil and watercolor painting, dry-point copper work and block printing," Denneler said. He became famous for his landscapes in oil and exhibited in many shows. He died in Lindsborg in 1954.

After the program, Marlene Carpenter called the business meeting to order. Members discussed the advertising for the Oil Painting Portrait Workshop the club will be having in February. Secretary Marj Brown, unable to attend the meeting, sent information to send television stations and newspapers and asked that Bev Kern be in charge of getting those mailed.




