

Acuay had just put on a basketball clinic free of charge for the fans attending the game. He was everywhere on the court grabbing rebounds, draining jumpers, picking players pockets and showing off his otherworldly leaping abilities by making acrobatic layups that left defenders asking themselves what the heck happened. > Acuay nailed a three-pointer with 3:52 remaining in the half to give Colby a 33-22 lead. A few moments later Acay seemed to be suspended in the air while burying a shot from the free-throw line.

The Trojans continued to broaden their lead later in the half when Acuay split the defense and made an acrobatic looking lay-up while drawing contact from a Blue Dragon defender. He hit the free throw, increasing Colby's lead to 42-25. The Trojans led 44-29 at the half.

Colby looked sharp defensively ito star the second half as they prevented Hutchinson from getting off any easy shots. The team received a big scare when Acuay held his shoulder in pain while the rest of the Trojans ran down court in two at 19-17. Sophomore Erick to play defense with less than nine

A time-out was called and Acuay would return when play resumed despite being in obvious pain. He played through the pain and appeared to be back to normal a few minutes later.

The Trojans' defense continued to thwart the Blue Dragons' offensive attack holding Hutchinson to 28 percent shooting in the half.

The victory offered the team a brief respite for a season that has been filled with disappointment and frustration. It was a big win for the Trojans. The Blue Dragons were no pushovers. Hutchinson went into the game 15-4 and 4-2 in Kansas Jayhawk Community College Conference's Western Division.

The win improved the Trojans' record to 4-17 and 2-5 in the western division.

Colby takes on Barton County at 8 p.m. tonight at Great Bend.




