Hornstra was named by the National Junior College Athletic Association to the pre-season All-American third-team as an infielder. In addition, Hornstra is listed as one of the top returning pitchers and hitters in Region VI. Last year as a freshman, Hornstra finished with a 5-2 record on the mound. In 46 innings pitched, he struck out 23 batters and had a 3.04 earned run average.


